At 0858 enemy tanks were seen at 963703. 8 enemy 0850 tanks were seen at 9770 and reported to Bde HQ. At 1220 enemy tanks were reported advancing along read to our HQ. At 1100% hrs, D Cey reported enemy tanks in considerable strength 1000 yds to their front.

D Coy moved to 319713 to improve the Bn fortress. C Coy report they had regulated an infantry attack but were being attacked by tanks and requested arty support. This was granted. Attack was repulsed. The Bn still sits on objective. 2230 Bn HQ attacked by Fanther tanks and infantry beginning at 2230 hrs. HRETTEVILLE "." ORGEUILLEUSE 0030 At 0030 hrs Bn HQ WAS SHELLED AND MACHINED GUNNED, when the enemy put in a tank and infantry attack on the town. One Panther tank pulled up outside Bn EQ and the essed jumped down and descended that as M/S suprender and was not with a suitable reply a FIAT best. The tank was then knocked out by a PIAT. Meanwhile a hot time was had by all as enemy tanks were all about the town blesting away at the men in their slit trenches and destroying one of our A/Tk guns. Thewhele sky was lit up by blazing roofs and burning tanks as well as our own parachute flares. At 0220 hrs, another tank was knocked out by a PIAT 0315 near our mertar positions. At 0315 bre, an enemy AA Marad car SD KFZ 140 ran up the main street of Bretteville and was knocked out by PIAT fire in Front of our Bn HQ. During the scrap, we lost seven carriers including one loaded with son. In return five Panther tanks were bagged in the vicinity of 0423 | Bn HQ. At 0423 Panther tanks left vicinity of Bn HQ and RVd a short distant away. We requested arty fire on them. This was granted. We were informed that tank support would be forth coming at first light. 0445 At 6445 hrs, the enemy put in determined attacks on all Coys, but were thrown back. 0745 Altogether a very hectic hight was spent by all. A bright new page was written in the records of this Bn. Everyone fought magnificently and although the picture locked black, there was no sign of wavering anywhere. In this attack, Capt R.G. Shinnan lost his life.
