In the afternoon our anti-tank boys had a real field day, as we set up two anti-tank 6 Pdr guns and fired them at a big pillbox. On questioning PW it was found that this pounding had really frightened them and they were very badly shaken up. An attack was planned for the evening to take place anytime after 2300 hrs. Flame throwers were to be used (lifebuoys) and also a platoon of MMG (CH of O) plus the six pounder, so Jerry had pretty well everything we could let loose at him. These pillboxes are really hard babies to crack and they are the very latest in defense fortifications for they have XXXX heavy concrete and big naval guns, plus A/A guns, Mortars, MG and small arms. Instructions have been received that our two Weasels must be turned in at 011130 by 2359 hrs and this was done by	Raf

KAPELLE St. PIETER MR. 006173	2nd Nov 1944	0700	Today is a day to be remembered by us for after having made attacks on the pillbox in the early morning, XXX which were unsuccessful, the enemy finally ran up the white flag in the afternoon. 8 PW were taken in the morning and were all NCOs who said they expected the garrison might give up soon. At about 1330 hrs the Major of the Garrison and 2 Other of his officers came out with Lt-Col Crofton of the 1 C Scot R and that was all for the BRECKEN pocket. Total PW were about 5 or 6 Officers and approx 350 other ranks. Some of our boys who had been taken prisoner by Jerry were OK and were brought out also. The pillboxes proved to be real thick concrete and made to last for a long time, there were many heavy guns around it and it certainly was well surrounded by weapons. Jerry had several wounded and we had a few also. Everybody is very happy that this fighting is over in this area. All afternoon was spent in getting the prisoners and wounded out. CO held an O Gp at 1930 hrs and gave details on Exercise "RELAX" --2 Day Rest in GHENT--This should prove a pretty good thing for we will be billeted in with the civilians.
